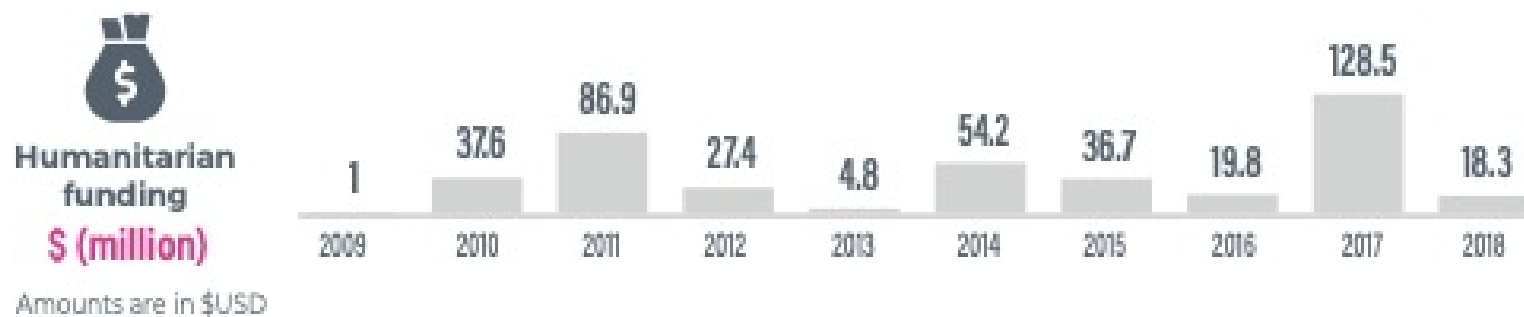
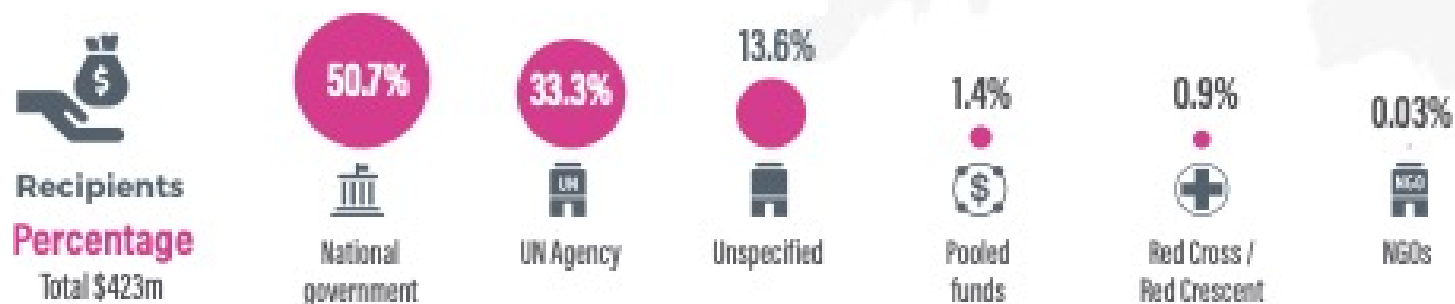

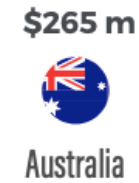
Top 5 crises funded

	Ebola West Africa 2014	\$47m

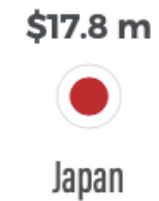


Comparing key donors: humanitarian aid to Asia Pacific 2013-17
