Key terms: data marginalisation

Data marginalisation refers to the processes through which **marginalised or underrepresented voices are hidden** through the process of inadequate data collection.

Key terms: disaggregated data

Disaggregated data refers to **data that can be separated into smaller parts** for the purposes of analysing trends and **providing better insights** and is necessary to being able to identify the **impacts of disasters on different communities.**

Key terms: national statistical offices (NSOs)

National statistical offices, or NSOs, are government departments or agencies that **collect, compile, and release official national-level population data**.

Key terms: organisations of persons with disabilities (OPDs)

Organisations of persons with disabilities, or OPDs, are representative organisations or groups of people with disabilities where **most of the overall staff, board, and volunteers in all levels** of the organisation are **people with disabilities**.

Key terms: monograph

A **monograph** is a detailed and thoroughly documented written study of a **single specialised subject** or field of inquiry.
