Want to work to support survivors of family and sexual violence in Papua New Guinea?

Femili PNG currently has two positions available—one is a part-time role, based in Canberra, for a Development Manager, the other an Australian Volunteer for International Development (AVID) role based with Oxfam PNG in Port Moresby for 12 months.

Femili PNG runs the Lae Case Management Centre (CMC), which works with a range of stakeholders to deliver services to survivors of family and sexual violence. You can find out more [on our website](#).

The Development Policy Centre and the National Centre for Epidemiology and Population Health at ANU currently support the CMC and Femili PNG on a pro-bono basis.

The **Development Manager** role is a senior part-time position for someone based in Canberra who is happy to make regular trips to PNG. It is a pivotal new position within the organisation and provides an exciting opportunity to take what has been initiated to the next level in terms of oversight, expansion, communications and fundraising. The AVID role is for a **Stakeholder Engagement Adviser**, based with Oxfam (our implementing partner for the project) in Port Moresby.
